

RAPP CONSTRUCTED RESPONSE RUBRIC

Restate the question. Change the question into a statement to begin and/or conclude your written response.

Answer the question. Write your answer in a complete sentence.

Prove it with the text. Be a text detective! Find 1 or 2 supporting details that prove your answer is correct and include them in your response.

Proofread and edit: Read through your response. Does it make sense? Double check your punctuation and spelling.

Daniel's and Isabella's father jumps out of planes and he helps with computers.

3/Meets Standard:

Dad works with computers in the army.

Daniel and Isabella's dad jumps out of planes in the army.

2/Approaching Standard:

Dad worked with computers.

Daniel's and Isabella's dad works with computers.

1/Limited Progress:

Dad workt

Work on computers
Jump out of planes.
